Charleston Veterans Day Parade commenced on November 6th. Honoring those who served America in times of peace and war, marching bands, military units, historic military vehicles, and veteran service organization floats traveled through downtown Charleston, cheered on by the families and crowds who lined the streets on a beautiful sunny day. Palmetto Chapter members **Mary Ann Jarmulowicz and Jerry Davidson** provided transport while others marched with fellow veterans, representing all those who have served our country. The Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center hosted this year's parade.

Many outstanding organizations are dedicated to helping our military members and their families. One of the most prominent of these is Soldiers' Angels, who in 2015 supported nearly 300,000 service and family members nation-wide! In the Charleston area, this organization assists homeless and hospitalized veterans at our VA hospital. Lorena Jordan, the Volunteer Service Site Coordinator for Soldiers' Angels at the Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center, spoke to our Chapter, identifying a critical need for hygiene kits for veterans. In response, our members brought in enough toiletry items - bottles of shampoo, lotion, body wash and bars of soap, toothbrushes and razors - to fill several boxes. Soldier's Angels volunteers will prepare and distribute kits made from these items to local veterans. One of the most needed items for our homeless vets is socks! Our 20+ Christmas party attendees came through in a big way, donating over 100 pairs of new socks for women and men. The socks were dropped off at the Ralph H. Johnson VA Medical Center for distribution.

**Jerry Davidson** met LT Beth Toolan, a Navy NC officer who was recently stationed in Guam, while she was "home" for training at Fort Jackson, SC. She attended the retirement of her father from the Marine Corps and enjoyed a quick "family reunion" in Charleston. Beth mentioned she was leaving the following day for a new assignment in Kandahar, Afghanistan. Our feeling was: She's not a member, but she's one of us! We have all experienced deployments and family separations, and decided to help make Christmas a little more cheerful for LT Toolan by mailing cards and gifts. We hope that other chapters around the country did the same for our Navy Nurses serving far from home.

The 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Reunion of the USS Forrestal, CVA/CV/AVT-59, was held in October 2016 in North Charleston, SC. Unfortunately, Hurricane Matthew blew into town, forcing the cancellation of all scheduled tours and preventing the arrival of their scheduled keynote speaker. CAPT Bob Williams, (husband of PCNNCA past President **Peggy Williams**), stepped in and shared his experience as a CV-59 pilot. Stationed aboard the Forrestal, CAPT Williams was preparing to launch his A-6 Intruder on July 29, 1967 when ordinance detonated on the deck of the carrier and initiated the now infamous Forrestal Fire, killing 134 shipmates and injuring 161. LCDR John McCain was one of the surviving pilots. As a result of **Peggy** attending the reunion and sharing our local VA support initiatives, the Forrestal Reunion's "Ship Store" volunteered to donate (via PCNNCA members), *hundreds* of USS Forrestal commemorative items, including short and long sleeved tee shirts, to the Ralph H. Johnson VA Hospital in Charleston.

The Palmetto Chapter joined with other individuals and organizations around the country by donating funds to support the Wreaths Across America initiative. On December 17, these remembrance wreaths were placed on the graves of our country's fallen heroes. To quote Karen Worcester, Executive Director of Wreaths Across America: We are not here to "decorate graves." We're here to remember not their *deaths*, but their *lives*.




