#### **Scholarship Committee**

Another year of challenges for the Scholarship Committee. The applications this year were of even better quality than previous years. It seems each year it is harder to make decisions about who should receive our scholarship. Thanks to the generosity of our members we were able to award three scholarships again this year.

Our first recipient is Emilie Turpen who is currently a student at Carrol College who will be graduating in May of 2025. Emilie believes that holistic patient care with an emphasis on understanding the impact of mental health on the ability to heal is central to providing nursing care. After graduation she desires to help change the focus of medical care from disease management to preventive health care. She is receiving our main scholarship of \$1,500.

Ranking second is Dakota Rundell who attends Bushnell University and will graduate in December 2024. She is in an Accelerated BSN program. Her initial degree is in Public Health and Human Science from Oregon State University. Holistic patient care based upon the foundational principles of compassion, integrity, and excellence form the foundation of her patient care. She believes lifelong learning is essential to providing quality effective patient care. She is receiving a scholarship of \$1,000.

Our third recipient is Miguel Olide-Gomez. He currently attends Linfield University and will graduate in December 2024. He believes that clinical skills and critical thinking skills are essential to his ability provide quality holistic patient care. He will receive a \$500 scholarship.

All 5 states using 2 letter gold abbreviations at the bottom of the circular logo will be very BUSY & chaotic

Designers all agreed that Baskerville Old Face is a favorite for logos

Please consider how the logos will look on apparel, such as dark blue, black & lighter colors, so may need to make changes if we wish to have dark & light t-shirt/shirts. The image was put over a taupe background & it washes it out

White mountains add contrast to the overall design.

Note: A total of 7 colors are in the logo, when you factor in the Nurse Corps vintage insignia colors & the blue colors in the mountains

I know the main logo is centered over the top & seems to be the standard/preferred. Nadyne's input on making it off center is because of how a logo over the right breast/chest looks if someone if heavy chested.

In summary it will be hard to please all, but feel we are making progress.
